

Colvon Young started working at AccessAbility in early Feb 2019. Upon his arrival, Colvon was not sure about entering the workforce, because he had little work experience. Although he has experienced challenges with his new role, he has made tremendous progress!


He started doing assembly work three days a week on AccessAbility's production floor. He did this for a little less than a month before taking on a new challenge by working on a community janitorial crew. Colvon really enjoyed working on the crew, but was dealing with some personal struggles. Colvon took a week off to reassess his personal situation and to prepare himself to continue working.



After his return, he and his case manager created new vocational goals, and he has made a complete change in his attitude and thought process. Colvon is happy with his current job and tasks involved, and he likes the people he works with. He comes in each day with a smile on his face, ready to start the day.

Colvon's long-term goal is to eventually work independently in the greater community, and is grateful that his case manager and job developers will be ready to support him when he is ready to make that change. He states that he would not be where he is now if it wasn't for the wonderful support he gets from his team each and every day!

Tenacious Tawa!

"I did some very bad things and lost my job," said Tawa. "I was very depressed, the days started to melt together, and I had very little motivation. I felt like I let my children down. My first job is being a strong, single mother to my children. I had to turn my life around to show them that they have they personal power to achieve."

Tawa set out on a journey to demonstrate for her children that they had the power to do anything. Unemployed and still needing to provide for two children and a grandchild, Tawa put in countless job applications. However, she was repeatedly

denied interviews because of her criminal past.

Through her own grit and tenacity, Tawa eventually landed an interview. This is was the same day that she started at Project Connect. She was immediately relieved when she started the program.

"Linda was extremely helpful," Tawa said. She helped me identify the job expectations of the position I interviewed for, helped me created a budget, and said they team [at Project Connect] were not just here to help me find work. They were there to support me through the whole process and help me move forward with my life, not just my job and my career."

Tawa is happy to report she landed the job. The pay is good, and it has full benefits. She is grateful that the team at Project Connect will be with her while she starts her job to help her overcome any additional obstacles.

Tawa looks forward to her future, and her vocational goals don't stop with her current job. She says it's important that she always maintains a reliable job in order to provide for her family, but she would eventually like to start her own laundry mat business. She also wants to be an advocate for people who need a second chance. With Tawa's positive attitude, innate ambition, and new outlook on life, we have no doubt she has the personal power to achieve her dreams.

"Also," Tawa said proudly, "My daughter achieved a full scholarship to a university in Washington, DC. She wants to be a lawyer. I have already succeeded in my job there!"
